

Introduction

VINA (Validating Informal and Non-formal Acquired Skills) is strategic partnership between 5 organisations from 5 EU member states, viz:

<u>EURO</u>, an Italian Research Centre, Promotion and EU Initiative, along with partner organisations from the Czech Republic (<u>Evropská rozvojová agentura s.r.o.</u>), Greece (<u>E- Compass</u>) and Poland (<u>Fundacja Instytut Rownowagi Spoleczno Ekonomicznej</u>) and the U.K. (<u>European Learning Network Ltd</u>).

The project is aimed at educators, assessors, lecturers and other main users who need to update competences and skills of adults in the informal and non-formal sector to match the needs of the 21st century. The project consortium will develop:

- · a database of Instruments for Validating Informal and Non-Formal Learning;
- · a Recognition Opportunities Tendency Analyser (R.O.T.A.)

By involving external partners, adult colleges, assessors, lecturers, public sector institutions, trainers, teachers and the wider community, the 5 partners will, through in-depth research, create a database and an easy-to-use online validation tool. Both will be available as an Open Resource.
